Miss Phyllis Fenner, librarian of an Elementary School on Long Island, New York, will appear in Chapel, Tuesday, April 24, to talk to the students on story-telling, and to tell stories. Miss Fenner's visit is sponsored by the School Library Association of Lancaster City and County, with the cooperation of two campus clubs, the Primary Club and the Library Science Club. The Association has invited members of the Primary Club and the Library Science Club, and also the supervisors of the Elementary Grades in the Training School to hear Miss Fenner speak in the evening at the Iris Club in Lancaster.
