

# DAY STUDENTS WIN CLOSE GAME FROM BOARDERS

## Extra Period Required to Decide 25-24 Battle.

An extra five minute period, after forty minutes of deadlock playing was required to decide the annual Day Student-Boarding Student basket ball game at Millersville Normal school Thursday afternoon when the Day Students gained a one-point decision over their rivals in a sizzling 25-24 game.

The score at the close of the second half found the teams in a 23-23 tie and in the succeeding five minutes the Day Students, with "Art" Herr performing, accounted for a field goal in the first play and held their opponents to but one foul goal, giving the former a one-point decision.

The game, although comparatively rough, was one of the fastest and closest competitive cage exhibits on the Normal floor this season. The score no time of the game was more than a 5-point advantage for either team.

The Boarding Students broke into the tally at the start with "Irv" Keen-

er leading off with two fouls. "Art" Herr followed for the "Day" five and the fight was on. During the following minutes the teams were tied at 4, 6 and 8 all when "Bob" Shaeffer sent the visitors into a lead which was strengthened by Herr to 12-8 score just to the half. A foul by Keener, a double pointed by Mattis and a foul by Fitzpatrick put the teams in a deadlock, 12-12 score at the half.

"Art" Herr broke the tie but a score by Keener again tied things up when the "Boarders" staged a rally and passed their rivals, 23-18, the greatest lead of either team during the game. A foul by Herr, and Oberholtzer set the pace at 23-23 with but one minute to play. Herr was called to shoot two fouls, the first rolled around the rim of the basket and rolled out while the second accounted for a clean-cut score, tying the game as the final whistle blew.

The game took on a more competitive nature on the return for the extra period. Herr sent over the winning toss of the game in the first play and the "Boarders" were held scoreless till near the close when Mattis made good a foul leaving the "Day" tossers with their one-point advantage and victory.

"Art" Herr, captain of the Day Students, was the featuring scorer of the game with 7 field and 3 foul goals totaling 17 of his team's 25 points. Keener and Mattis led in the scoring for the Boarding Students. Stehman and Oberholtzer were strong on the defensive for the victors. Score:
