

# Susquehanna U. Tops Marauder Harriers, 26-29

Millersville State College's cross country record fell to 5-4-1 as the Marauders lost a tight 26-29 decision to Susquehanna University at Millersville.

The Crusaders' Bob Hatfield led the pack across the line with a clocking of 26:13. The visitors further insured their victory by taking third, fifth, eighth and ninth places.

Marauder ace Marty McGehean led the home thinclads with a second place finish in 27:12. Steve Frey captured the fourth place position.

#### Record Set

On Saturday McGehean set a Millersville record for the home course as he led the Marauders to a 25-30 win over Lock Haven. McGehean's time for the 5.2 mile course was 26:46.

Wednesday's home meet with Elizabethtown College proved the reverse as the Blue Jays defeated the Millersville harriers by a 19-39 verdict. McGehean earned second place honors.

Highlight of the collegiate cross country season is the annual Pennsylvania State College Cross Country Championships which will be held at West Chester on Saturday. Participants from West Chester, Lock Haven, Cheyney, Slippery Rock and Millersville State Colleges will compete starting at 2 p.m.

#### Lack of Depth

Regarding the competition, Coach Art Hulme cites West Chester as the favored team. He points to Millersville's lack of depth through numbers as a serious handicap.

"When you have a small team, such as ours, injuries make you keep your fingers crossed," he

said. "Mine are crossed."

With the seasonal loss of sophomore Paul Rhoads, number two man, and the uncertain status of captain Phil Muth, Marauder hopes have dimmed somewhat.

Yet coach Hulme expects to pluck one of the top three spots because of the team's fine showing in the Lock Haven meet, when each of the top Millersville harriers established new personal records.
