Dr. Rupp organized and coached the first varsity wrestling team at MSC, starting in 1946 and continuing until 1958 when he retired from coaching because of the press of language department duties.

His teams won two State College championships and were runners-up for the title four times; they were never below 4th place at any time, and produced 23 individual champions.

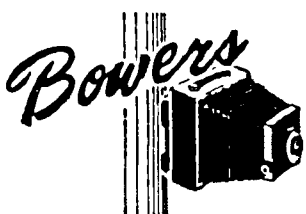
